February 2020 Focus Groups with Parents, Residents, Staff and Students



#### 7 groups with 130 participants

- Parents: 3 groups with 40 current parents
- **Staff: 2** groups with **37** teachers and other staff
- **Students: 1** groups ... **39** Hudsonville HS almost all12th-graders
- Community: 1 group with 14 business, civic and church representatives



### Theme #1: Relationships and connections



# Relationships and connections continue to fill the heart of the culture and shared values enveloping Hudsonville Public Schools



#### "I want to be here!"



- Caring, committed and dedicated teachers
  - ... "The teachers are really invested in our students."
- Involved parents and community ... "Parents are supportive and involved, they know what their kids are doing."
- Hudsonville's small-town feel ... "The district is large but it doesn't feel that way because the community is tight."



- Links and other buddy programs ... "Every kid is different, and you can grow yourself as much as they can."
- Can count on administrators
  ... "I've always been very well supported
  - by administrators, both at the school and district levels."
- Able to collaborate with colleagues ... "We share a lot so we're teaching the same thing at the same level with the same depth."

### Theme #2: High quality education



### "A strong focus on academics."



- Prepared for college
  - ... "College was easy for our daughters."
- Competitive
  - ... "As you have conversations with parents from other districts, you get a good feeling about what our kids are working on here."
- More attention requested for students who do not plan to go to college ... "What about the kids who aren't going to college?"

### Theme #3: Help for students struggling academically



- Just ask a teacher ... "Teachers are available, you just have to ask."
- Intervention ... "Teachers do an amazing job of identifying when a child needs additional coaching."
- Parents admit they do not understand how math is taught today ... "You need a teacher to come in and explain it in person to parents."



## Theme #4: Expand world language instruction



- Elementary school special ... "The earlier it starts, the easier it is to learn."
- Cultural literacy
  ... "Another language would teach an appreciation for another culture, we need

to embrace other cultures."

- No consensus on any single language
  - ... "I wouldn't care what language, any second language would expand their minds."

### Theme #5: More carts with laptops needed



- Teachers ask for more devices ... "You have to sign up for the laptops at least three weeks in advance or you won't get one."
- Parents are uncertain about the need for 1:1
  - ... "Technology is great but we lose the human element, do kids know how to talk and communicate?"



- Parents and teachers prefer the devices stay at school
  - ... "I don't want the stress of worrying about my 4th-grader bringing it home."
  - ... "It's easier to monitor the laptops if they're on carts than if they're allowed to bring them home."

### Theme #6: Restrict cell phones in school



- Cell phones ubiquitous at the secondary level
   ... Staff and parents report almost all HS students and many MS students and even some upper elementary students have a cell phone at school.
- Valued by some teachers in a few classrooms as an instructional tool ... "We use them quite a bit in my labs, some things are much easier to do on a phone than on a laptop."

• A policy on cell phone use would be welcome, especially to restrict their use in the classroom

... "It's a huge distraction for teachers and other students."

... "Perhaps there could be a compromise where there's no cell phone in the classroom where we're learning but it's ok at lunch or in passing time."

### Theme #7: More support for extreme behaviors



- More children with extreme social, emotional or behavioral issues, especially younger elementary level
  - ... "We're seeing a lot more big behaviors, although I know it's not just Hudsonville."
  - ... "When I switched from middle to elementary school, I was shocked at the number of extreme behavior on a daily basis at the elementary."

• Teachers and parents appreciate HPS hiring additional mental health professionals, but more resources are still needed

... "Teachers are going above and beyond to help struggling students, but the biggest problem is beyond the teachers."

... "I know you're working on it but it feels like such an emergency at times."

 Parents welcome information from HPS about community mental health resources

... "There's a lot of parents who don't know where to go or who is good."

... "There's a gap between providing the mental health resources in the schools and becoming a triage place for mental health resources."



### Theme #8: Facilities



- Cannot wait for the new school space
  - ... "It's just way too big, you can't get to know everyone, we're just waiting for the new 5-6 school."
- Smart design
  - ... "You get a favorable first impression when you walk in, including from the office people."



### • Overall satisfied with building maintenance

... "The district does a good job, our maintenance guy at our school is phenomenal."

... "You can't find a shred of paper on the floor."



### Theme #9: Communications



### • Universal platform from teachers to parents

... "Can they find an app that's applicable for all, I have four or five apps from different teachers?"

... "I don't have time to check six different websites."



- Appreciate PowerSchool
  - ... "Once your kid is in middle school, you can know every assignment your kid has and every grade they earn."
- Email Appleseed to residents without kids currently in school ... "I don't have kids in school, is there any way we can get to know what is going on in the school district, we want to be more engaged."
