Goal #1: Enhance and communicate school readiness opportunities and community resources for children birth to age five.

Strategies/activities:

- Discuss and develop understanding of current offerings
- Determine if programing and resources assist parent/staff in preparing their students for kindergarten readiness
- Share with parents the upcoming change of kindergarten start dates and how this will affect their children
- Initiate discussion on Early Childhood building usage considering goal and define common goals for 0-5 year old population in HPS
- Develop multiple communique around school readiness opportunities and community resources to parents and staff

Results:

- Postcard sent to HPS community regarding Hudsonville Early Childhood offerings and informational nights
- HPS Early Childhood informational nights on January 17 at Riley Street Middle School and January 21 at Bauer Elementary School
 - ▶ 2013 attendance: Riley ~ 71, Bauer ~ 26 **TOTAL = 97 families**
 - ▶ 2012 attendance: Riley ~ 45, Bauer ~ 26 TOTAL = 71 families
- Developed an early childhood profile document to aide in communication between Early Childhood programs/Prekindergarten and our Kindergarten classrooms
- Incredible growth in Early Childhood programs this year, most of our programs are full or very close to full as of May, 2013
- Full day of Great Start Readiness Preschool, state-funded program this year, creating 17 more spots, one classroom, for our students

 Determine primary objective: Increase the number of students who feel that staff know and care about them

(elementary - 74%, middle school - 45%, high school - 39%)

- Research ways to make a large school feel small
- Assess current programming
