



S.O.A.R. II Community Research Focus Groups Key Findings

January 10th, 2014

- 1. The "caring teachers" and other staff are the greatest asset of Hudsonville Public Schools. Students and parents applied them for their commitment and personal attention ... "they're good at what they do, they love what they do, and they love their kids."
- 2. Staff and parents both welcome the **high level of parent involvement** with their children's education, as well the **support from the larger Hudsonville community** ... "when you talk with parents about their children, they're going to do something about it, it's not going to fall on deaf ears."
- 3. Many **families choose to live in Hudsonville because of the quality of its schools**, especially parents who have moved to the west Michigan area from another ... "*I'm impressed with the things my kids come home knowing, I didn't know as much when I was their age*" and "the numbers are consistently high on the State exams, from elementary school through high school."
- 4. Many Hudsonville students are confident they'll be prepared for college, but also worry that they may be too protected and supported by their teachers and parents ... "we're spoon-fed here, but in college that won't be happening."
- 5. Students are uncertain if their writing skills, especially to write persuasively, are adequate ... "I can write a good structure, but need help in putting it all together."

 Their teachers agree ... "we're not giving them enough writing experience."

 Moreover, their parents are not surprised given what they observe with writing skills lacking in their workplaces ... "writing skills are a big thing, many students do not have good writing skills."
- 6. Some parents ask for more programs for their academically advanced students, especially in elementary schools ... "there's some kids who are ahead and need to be pushed."
- 7. While Hudsonville students say they feel safe at school because "our community is safe," parents and staff also feel their Hudsonville schools are safe but this is tempered by their acknowledgement that no place is completely safe any more ... "it's as safe as the world we live in."



8. Parents feel that the district is taking actions proactively to prevent bullying as well as enforcing policies against it ... "you cannot prevent every act of bullying, but I'm glad the school has it eyes out and shuts it down."

Students, staff and parents feel that **bullying is probably worse at the middle schools where friendships are evolving and tested** ... "you're getting kids at middle school filtering in from all the elementaries, and they're trying to find their place."

The high school students add that most students are nice to each other and support each other, with most of them belonging to multiple social circles ... "there's drama everywhere, but less here" and "we all have different groups of friends."

Parents agree there should be a required class in Digital Citizenship to further prevent and discourage cyber bullying ... "it needs to start younger, kids are more advanced today, and then reinforced."

While staff and parents **expect the new Performing Arts Center will encourage interest in and support for performing arts activities**, staff and students feel that **performing arts activities are not as appreciated to the extent as are athletics** ... "you don't hear about the music performance like you do the big game."
- 10. Many parents believe the size of schools such as Hudsonville permit only a few students to compete on high school teams, with opportunities limited to those who extensively play on a travel team ... "if you're child is not on a travel team, there's the feeling that your kid has no chance, that's kind of sad."
