Summer EBT Money for Approved Free/Reduced Eligible Students ~ In 2022, federal legislation created a new program to fill hunger gaps during summer break, called Summer EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer). The program is being administered by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) and the Michigan Department of Education (MDE). A household can receive \$40 per month per child in June, July, and August 2024 (for a total of \$120 per child). Benefits will come in the form of preloaded cards that families can use to purchase groceries.

Summer EBT benefits will be issued to students who have a completed and approved Application for Meal Benefits on file as of February 14, 2024.

If you already have an approved application, automatically receive Free or Reduced Meal Benefits, or already receive EBT Benefits, you do NOT need to re-apply.

Completion of the form does not automatically qualify your student for the summer benefits. These benefits will be based on annual incomes and household size as noted by you on the form.

If your address has changed this year, be sure to update it with your school to ensure your benefit card is sent to the right address.

This **WILL NOT** impact your student receiving free breakfast and lunch at school.

HOMEWORK HELP

Homework Help will be offered to <u>6th grade</u> students on **Monday-Friday mornings from** 7:20AM-7:45AM in Room 203.

Homework Help will be offered for <u>7th & 8th grade</u> students **Tuesday-Friday from** 7:20AM-7:45AM in Room 319.

These are **quiet** environments where students will receive academic support, if needed, from instructional para professionals, study quietly on their own, read, etc.

Additionally, **Lunch and Learn** is offered **Monday-Thursday in Room 319**. Students may get their lunch, sign in, and complete homework, study, or take (or retake) tests or quizzes (with teacher permission). This quiet environment allows students to receive academic support or complete missing work from absences. This room is staffed by one RMS staff member as well as volunteer parents.

Morning Student Drop Off Zone ~ There is a designated loop for student drop off on the east side of the building. We ask that you do not use the front parking lot as a drop off area for your student in the morning. Using the front parking lot for this purpose creates a hazardous environment in the morning for staff, parents and volunteers who need to use this lot for parking. The purpose of the front lot/circle drive is for a parent or volunteer who needs to come into the building or for late drop off or early pickup of a student due to an appointment or illness. Please help us keep this area safe.

Leaving School During the School Day ~ If a student must leave at any time during the school day, parents are asked to phone or write a note stating the reason for early dismissal and the time their child needs to be dismissed. Students should bring the note directly to the office before the school day begins for an early dismissal pass. This pass should be shown to their teacher at the beginning of the class from which they will be leaving.



Should a student need to leave school due to sudden illness or injury, the student should come to the office. Students should NOT call home from their cell phone to be picked up if they are injured or ill. The office will call parents to pick up the student. Students will be signed out in the office before they leave.

Early Release Dates ~ The remaining dates for early release are February 23, March 15, May 3 and our last day of school, June 5. On the early release dates, students will be dismissed at 11:15am. The purpose of the early release is to provide quality collaborative time for our staff to review assessment data and discuss best practices with the goal of improving student achievement.

On the early release days, transportation will be provided in the same manner as it would be at the end of the school day only beginning at 11:15am instead of 2:45pm. A sack lunch will be made available to students who would like to bring one home on the bus. Students must preorder these lunches and the deadline for ordering a lunch is 9:30AM on the day of each early release day.



Parents of 6th Grade Students:

Immunizations ~ Most 6th grade students need a couple of new immunizations (Meningitis and T-dap) after turning 11 and before entering 7th grade. Students are assessed as they enter 7th grade and must be up-to-date before they can start school for their 7th grade year. As your 6th grader has their well-child check-ups and receives the updated immunizations, please obtain a copy of their updated official immunization record and give a copy to the RMS office anytime this year. (We are required to have a copy of this official document in their file.)



Immunization Waivers ~ If you are a parent who chooses to waive immunizations for your child, please know that if you haven't gotten a new waiver since your child turned 11, you will most likely need to get a new waiver which states Riley Street Middle School as the current school and also includes the new immunizations that were not previously required. Getting a new waiver requires making an appointment at the Ottawa County Department of Public Health 616.396.5266. Only waivers that are obtained this way are accepted as valid.
