A Message from Mr. Ross...

We look forward to welcoming your child(ren) back to school on April 8th. The final two months of the school year will afford students the opportunity to learn new things and refine skills in preparation for their next grade-level. A positive attitude about learning and "best" effort will help students find success during our final grading quarter.

I have discovered over the course of my career in education that in many cases "good" teaching practices are often interrelated to "good" parenting practices. Over the past several years our staff has engaged in professional learning centered on Reinforcing Effort and Providing Recognition to our students. Promoting effort and providing recognition to children is also a fundamental parenting technique that will lead to the development of stronger, more resilient young men and women.

Getting our students to buy in to and believe that "effort" is critical in the learning process can be challenging with the 11-15 year olds that we serve. Middle school students often develop a fixed mindset about their own skills and abilities as a learner. "I'm not a good math student" or "I'm not very artistic" are common statements made by our students. Both parents and educators can help students overcome a fixed mindset by getting them to believe in the power of effort. Educational researchers Marzano. Pickering, and Pollock bring to light "If you believe that effort is the most important factor in achievement, you have a motivational tool that can apply to any situation."

Ultimately, parents and educators should be working together to establish a culture of effort by encouraging every child to achieve their personal best. In some cases, a student's personal best may be earning a "C" in every class or just passing every class. For other students, a personal best may include making the honor roll by earning all "A's" and "B's" or achieving Blue Renaissance status for improving their grade point average by a 1/2 point. For the achievement of any personal best, let's be sure as educators and parents to provide authentic praise and recognition for the EFFORT put forth by our students.

Immunization Waivers ~ If you are a parent who chooses to waive immunizations for your child, please know that if you haven't gotten a new waiver since your child turned 11, you will most likely need to get a new waiver which states Riley Street Middle School as the current school and also includes the new immunizations that were not previously required. Getting a new waiver requires making an appointment at the Ottawa County Department of Public Health 616.396.5266. Only waivers that are obtained this way are accepted as valid.
