Early Fe Release 11 Day!

Early Release Dates ~ The remaining dates for early release are October 20, November 10, December 15, January 26, February 23, March 15, May 3 and our last day of school, June 5. On the early release dates, students will be dismissed at 11:15am. The purpose of the early release is to provide quality collaborative time for our staff to review assessment data and discuss best practices with the goal of improving student achievement.

On the early release days, transportation will be provided in the same manner as it would be at the end of the school day only beginning at 11:15am instead of 2:45pm. A sack lunch will be made available to students who would like to bring one home on the bus. Students must preorder these lunches and the deadline for ordering a lunch is 9:30AM on the day of each early release day.

Leaving School During the School Day ~ If a student must leave at any time during the school day, parents are asked to phone or write a note stating the reason for early dismissal and the time their child needs to be dismissed. Students should bring the note directly to the office before the school day begins for an early dismissal pass. This pass should be shown to their teacher at the beginning of the class from which they will be leaving.



Should a student need to leave school due to sudden illness or injury, the student should come to the office. <u>Students should NOT call home from their cell phone to be picked up if they are injured or ill.</u> The office will call parents to pick up the student. Students will be signed out in the office before they leave.

Choice Reading at Riley

Reading is a central focus in our classrooms -- and not just in English classes. One of our highest priorities is to provide a solid foundation upon which our students can grow and develop as lifelong readers. As is true of any skill, reading is a skill developed through intentional practice. The reading or practice students do as part of their ELA classes in the reading workshop allows them to develop the stamina they need for success as they continue their education throughout middle school, high school, and beyond. We know that one of the most important indicators of success in high school and college is the ability to read and comprehend complex text fluently, and that skill isn't one to be quickly activated. Just like training for a marathon, training for the complex reading of high school and beyond takes regular practice in gradually more complex books. This is one reason at least 20 minutes of reading is required of all students every night. We want the students at Riley Street Middle School to be building a reading habit, training regularly.

In our classrooms, we make every effort to provide students with opportunities for the practice they need to establish and maintain reading lives. To that end, some of our ELA teachers continually work to develop classroom libraries containing a wide variety of texts to support all readers. Classroom libraries include a broad range of books regarding issues, topics, styles, genres, and readability. We strive to have interesting, relevant, challenging texts for all readers in order to provide students at varying levels the ability to scaffold their skills throughout middle school. Because classroom libraries are continually growing and changing, it is not possible for teachers to read every book before adding it to a classroom library. To select materials for their classroom libraries, teachers rely on recommendations from students, staff, and a variety of additional review sources.

While teachers may recommend books based on your student's interest, rest assured that books from classroom libraries are never assigned; students are allowed free choice concerning their independent reading selections. We realize that each family has a unique set of standards regarding what is considered acceptable reading material. As a parent or guardian, you set standards to help your child decide which movies, TV shows, music, apps, and video games are acceptable for your family. In the same manner, we encourage you to talk with your child about your family's standards for selecting reading materials, to remain aware of the books your child is selecting throughout the year, and to assist in determining appropriateness. Independent reading books are chosen by your child, so there can certainly be other choices if you are not satisfied with any book. Students are not at all limited to reading only the books in classroom libraries. Many students also purchase new or used books from book stores or thrift shops, borrow from friends or family, or use the public or school libraries.

We are excited to see the growth all students make this school year with the books they choose. This reading foundation is crucial to your student's future success in high school and beyond, and we can't wait to help foster a reading life in your child.

If you completed the forms for a fall sport, you don't need to re-submit the forms. Competitive Cheer is a separate fee (club fee).
